Q: Who attends Conference?

A: Conference is the largest gathering of its kind in the Hispanic community, serving as the meeting ground for thousands of community leaders, activists, and volunteers; elected and appointed officials; members of the corporate, philanthropic, and academic communities; senior citizens; college students; and youth.

Q: What is the purpose of Conference?

A: Conference provides a forum for training and networking for members of the Hispanic community. Community-based organizations, corporate representatives, and government officials convene at the UnidosUS Annual Conference to learn about and discuss ongoing and emerging issues that affect the Latino community.

EVENTS AND PROGRAMS

Q: What events take place at Conference?

A: The UnidosUS Annual Conference hosts numerous town halls and workshops about issues impacting the lives of Hispanic Americans. In addition, Conference features the National Family Latino Expo, which includes over 100 exhibitors, free health screenings, live entertainment, free giveaways, and product samplings from Fortune 500 companies, community organizations, and government agencies. It also features the UnidosUS Family/Familia Pavilion, which highlights UnidosUS's advocacy efforts and programs.

Q: Are there any other special programs offered at Conference?

A: The *Líderes* Summit is the youth component of the UnidosUS Annual Conference and targets Latino high school and college students, youth leaders, and young professionals. Customized for the two identified age groups, the *Líderes* Summit is based on UnidosUS's long-standing work in youth leadership development. The Rising Leaders track is focused on the academic and leadership development of 14–17-year-old participants, while the Avanzando track focuses on college success, job readiness, and civic engagement for participants 18–23 years of age. The Summit begins on the morning of Saturday, July 7 with youth-tailored events and opportunities but also allows participants to take part in the various general session meal events and other dialogues within the Annual Conference schedule.

UnidosUS Conference workshops offer a chance for participants to earn UnidosUS Certificates of Professional Development in the various issue areas covered at Conference: Nonprofit Management; Housing and Community Development; Education; Health; Policy; STEM; and Workforce Development. By completing a series of workshops, attendees gain valuable insight, training, resources, research, and tools to enhance program and service delivery in their nonprofit organizations. The Professional Development Certificate Program is open to registered attendees of the UnidosUS Annual Conference.

REGISTRATION

Q: What is the registration fee?

A: Conference registration rates vary by registration date and affiliation. Register today!

Q: Can I submit my registration by phone?

A: We do not take registration via phone. You can use the online form or we can mail you a hard copy to fax or mail to UnidosUS.

Q: What forms of payment do you accept?

Q: Can I register now and pay later?

A: Yes, you may register today and pay for your registration at a later date, as long as you pay before the end of your registration tier. If you pay after the tier deadline, you will need to pay the next tier's rate.

Q: Are there discounts on multiple registrations?

A: Yes, group discounts are available. If a group purchases ten (10) registrations, they will receive one (1) additional registration at no charge, and every 10th registration from there on out will be complimentary as well. Registrations must be of the same type purchased at the same time to qualify for this discount, i.e. 10 Senior or 10 Premium registrations. Splitting registrations and purchasing them separately will prevent you from obtaining the group discount.

Q: Can I attend Conference events without registering?

A: The National Latino Family Expo as well as all Conference workshops and town halls are free and open to the public. Meal and Special Events are closed to the public; open to registrants only.

Q: What does the Conference registration include?

A: Conference registration includes access to all meal functions and select evening events, as well as all workshops, town halls, and the National Latino Family Expo.

Q: Do I have to pay the Conference registration fee to attend the workshops?

A: No. All Conference workshops, town halls, and National Latino Family Expo events are free and open to the public. However, those interested in only attending the Conference workshops and town halls must still check in and obtain a complimentary workshop badge. Attendance without an appropriate Conference badge will not be permitted.
