2017 *Líderes* Summit FAQ

Q. What is the purpose of the *Líderes* Summit?

A. The purpose of the Summit is to foster a community of young Latino leaders equipped with the skills, agency, and mindset necessary to successfully navigate and improve systems that directly impact our community and American society.

Q. Can students attend the 2017 NCLR Annual Conference's evening events?

A. If you are bringing a group of high school age students (the Rising Leaders track), you must always be present with them when they are not in the Phoenix Convention Center. This includes during evening events which may take place off-site. We will not receive Rising Leaders students at evening events if they are not accompanied by their chaperone.

Q. How will students be seated during the meal events?

Seating is at a premium during meal events. It can be challenging for groups to find a table to sit together. As a courtesy, *Líderes* participants have the opportunity to be seated early at meal events. For priority seating, please arrive at the indicated pre-seating entrance 15 minutes prior to the event's start time. Event staff will then usher your group to the *Líderes* seating section.

Q. Is there a suggested packing list?

A. Please confirm whether your students have allergies, medical conditions, or dietary restrictions, and whether they will need to bring their medication, inhaler, or other important items before leaving. Also, ensure that students have sweatshirts or jackets with them, because the air conditioning in convention centers can be strong. Additionally, don't forget to make sure you bring notepads for youth to take notes during the workshops and sessions. Also, if youth have business cards or contact info, they should bring that information, so they can participate in the Summit's networking opportunities.

Q. How should I prepare for the heat in Arizona?

A. The Sheraton Grand Phoenix, our Conference hotel, and the Convention Center are extremely close together. However, groups should still plan on being prepared to deal with heat while outside. Please bring sunscreen, and make sure your group regularly drinks water. Be careful to monitor how long your group is outside in the heat.

- Q.** What transportation will be available from the airport to the Conference hotel and Convention Center?
- A.** From the airport, you and your students can access the Metro Light Rail, with stops at the Convention Center that are also only blocks from the Conference hotel. The Metro Light Rail can also be used to explore downtown Phoenix. However, other transportation options, such as taxis and rental cars, are available in the city. - Q.** Are there specific instructions for group registrations?
- A.** If you are registering multiple participants, you will need to begin the registration with the group's primary contact, and then add the additional registrants under that individual.
