



HEALTH ISSUES AND PRIORITIES: LATINO VOTERS IN THE 2020 ELECTORATE

About the Survey

- Total N=1,304 Latino registered voters (+/- 2.7%)
 - Oversamples in Arizona, California, Colorado, Florida, Texas (+/- 7%)
- Field Dates: October 3-10, 2020
- English or Spanish, according to preference
- Blended sample, online and live telephone interviews
- Content: health-related priorities and policy support

Key Findings

Coronavirus pandemic top of mind as Latinos go to the polls

- Other priorities are pandemic adjacent: unemployment and health care
- Pessimism that the pandemic will not end soon, and distrust Trump on the issue

Understand the imperative of protective measures (social distancing, masks, etc.) but want Congress to do their part, take action on ongoing health and economic stresses

- Testing/treatment, health insurance cost/coverage, health/nutrition programs for low-income
- Majority of Latino voters, across all states and demographic groups, very concerned the Supreme Court could strike down ACA protections.

Biden Heavy Favorite

- Holds 34-point margin with Latino reg voters, 40-points among likely Latino reg voters
- Ahead with every demographic segment (state, age, gender, origin group, etc)
- 14% have already voted, another 67% certain they will vote




Specific Concerns About Coronavirus / Pandemic

When it comes to the coronavirus and its impact to you, your family, and your own circumstances, how concerned are you about each of the following? (Percent VERY concerned illustrated)





When it comes to the coronavirus and its impact to you, your family, and your own circumstances, how concerned are you about each of the following? (Percent very and somewhat concerned illustrated)




Pessimism about pandemic ending soon





Doctors and health experts trusted information sources on coronavirus vaccine safety and development


How much do you trust each of the following to provide accurate information about the development and safety of a coronavirus vaccine?

How much do you trust each of the following to provide accurate information about the development and safety of a coronavirus vaccine? (Percent great deal and mostly trust illustrated)




Substantial interest in getting vaccine when it becomes available

(Total likely to get vaccine illustrated)




Reservations about long-term and side effects, and effectiveness


Very important to continue behaviors to lower risk of contracting virus

(Percent very important illustrated)






How concerned are you about each of the following parts of the ACA being eliminated



Widespread concern that the Supreme Court could do away with entire ACA


How concerned are you that the Supreme Court could do away with the entire Affordable Care Act, getting rid of all protections provided in the law at once? (Percent very concerned illustrated)



Extensive support for health insurance for children regardless of citizenship, and increased funding for mental health support


When it comes to action the next Congress and Presidential Administration could take, which of these policies do you support?



(Percent strongly and somewhat support illustrated)




Nearly all registered plan to vote, 14% already did, and growing daily

Takeaways

Coronavirus pandemic driving concern

- Related: unemployment and health care, consistent across states and demographic groups
- Latino voters take the pandemic seriously, want a vaccine, but do not trust President Trump and have worry about what lies ahead.
- Want Congress to address ongoing pandemic-induced economic and health crisis facing the community now: testing/treatment access, health insurance costs and coverage, unemployment
- Serious concern about losing ACA protections in the midst of pandemic that has taken enormous toll on the community.
